What skills will an online DEI Officer have once they have completed the training?

Online DEI Officers will be able to:

- Identify psychological, social, and academic barriers linked to marginalization in online spaces.
- Consult with faculty members and instructional designers on future course design.
- Consult with faculty members on race, social justice, access, etc. and its educational implications.
- Engage and support online students within the online space.
- Facilitate Title IX complaints for online learners.
- Facilitate meaningful discussions about social justice and inequity when necessary or requested.
- Mentor students struggling with marginalization or environmental issues in the online space.
